

Aim

The Breathe Easy All Together (BEAT) peer-leadership program aims to empower students by providing them with the knowledge, skills and confidence to make informed decisions about e-cigarette use and advocate for respiratory health.

The objectives of the program are to:

- 1. Increase students' knowledge about asthma and its management.
- 2. Improve students' awareness that vaping is not the norm for adolescents.
- 3. Increase students' knowledge of e-cigarettes, harms and alternatives to use.
- 4. Encourage students to say no to e-cigarettes.
- 5. Enable students to discern marketing strategies employed to target young people.
- 6. Enhance students' leadership and advocacy skills.




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Program Model for Breathe Easy All Together (BEAT)



- Features a flexible implementation approach.
- Utilises a peer-education model proven effective through the SALSA and Triple A program.
- Target audience: Year 10 & Year 7 high school students.
- Year 10 students participate in a one-day workshop where they are trained as BEAT Peer Leaders and develop their own e-cigarette prevention messaging which is shared with their school community.
- Year 10 students deliver peer education to Year 7 students during two school periods. This includes the facilitation of an online course and interactive activities to build Year 7 students' e-cigarette knowledge and resilience to tobacco use.
